FEPOA Annual Meeting

Thursday February 25th, 2016 Prepared by FEPOA Secretary Chris Mitchell Submitted on 2/27/16

Thirty-eight member households were noted to be in attendance, including proxies. A quorum was established. The annual meeting was called to order at 7:15pm after member registration and refreshments. Discussion ensued around the agenda topics below.

1. Sign in, register proxies, update name/address/email

2. 2015 minutes read and approved

3. Vote for hand raising versus voice voting

 a. A motion was made, seconded, and passed unanimously to accept hand-raising

4. Introduction of Board members and HOA members

5. Trash Service

- a. Unanimously approved to continue with current RAM service
- b. HOA members reminded that RAM does carry a "green" trash pick-up if desired by individual homeowner

6. 2016 Budget Review

- a. General discussion of budget and dues
- b. Common space maintenance budget increased from \$2000 to \$6000
- c. Discussion of how HOA money is budgeted
- d. Discussion of potential big budget costs such as bridge replacement and engineering
- e. Dues will stay at \$100 annually

7. Common Space Discussion

- a. Discussed maintaining bridge by treating wood
- b. Spraying for Canadian Thistle
 - 1. This is required by city of Fort Collins
 - 2. The HOA did hire an approved company for this spraying in 2015 but members of the HOA "ran him off" so the spraying was incomplete
 - 3. The Board will obtain bids and hire a company to spray in 2016

- c. Entrance way signs/flower beds
 - 1. Discussed (like in 2015) changing from perennials to more evergreen
 - 2. HOA Board will obtain bids and make this happen in 2016

8. Homeless Concerns

- a. Issue raised that several homeless people are sleeping around pond and near public service building
- b. Homeless are getting scrap material from Wal-Mart and HomeDepot and using this to set up temporary shelters
- Issue raised that the police will not respond if "No Trespassing" signs are not posted
 - 1. Reassured HOA that there are multiple signs posted in the common areas
- d. How does or should the HOA handle this?
 - 1. Individual homeowners should call police with each incident and document that the police were called
 - a. Where should this be documented?
 - b. No centralized way to document this
 - c. Should the HOA Board be notified and send a letter to the police with each incident?
 - 2. Increase HOA awareness
 - 3. Les Kaplan will fashion a letter to send to the city and the police department
 - a. the letter will detail concerns regarding "sanitation", "intoxication", "vandalism", "safety", etc.)
 - b. Les will email the letter to the HOA president,
 - c. The HOA Board will them approve the letter and send it to the city
 - d. Ideally, the letter would include a map documenting the locations of the occurences
 - 4. The HOA will request a general information meeting with the city's "public safety officer" or the "neighborhood security department representative"
 - a. Agenda of this meeting
 - 1. How to approach homeless?
 - 2. Does HOA need more signs posted?
 - 3. How to resolved issue in general?
 - b. The HOA will send out invitations to this meeting to homeowners
 - Should HOA hire a security company to patrol neighborhood
 - a. HOA Board could obtain bids for this
 - b. There is money in the budget for this
- e. Abandoned shopping carts
 - 1. This can be reported to Wal-Mart and they will retrieve them

9. "No Outlet" sign posted

- a. Request made to post additional "No Outlet" sign on Hogan
- b. No action plan decided on

10. Road Upkeep

- a. As part of the annexation agreement, the city will inspect the streets and possibly maintain them
- b. Should we approach the city to help maintain the roads?
 - 1. No agreement reached

11. Power/Electrical work

- a. When are they going to finish? Nobody knows for sure
- b. Some people still aren't finished

12. Notification from utility companies

- a. Is there a way to ensure pre-notification when the utility companies will be performing work on private property?
- b. This will be brought up when the HOA meets with the city

13. Pond Maintenance

- a. The city is using these ponds as "settling" ponds for sediment/silt from stormwater
- b. This has never been approved by the HOA
- c. This process degrades the quality of the ponds by increased sediment and pollution
 - 1. The ponds used to be clean enough to swim in
- d. The ponds are a "private amenity" that are being used by the city to serve a "public function"
- e. The HOA needs to bring this to the city's attention
- f. Discussion regarding what the "stormwater" fee goes to
- g. Should the city be regularly maintaining the ponds?

14. Mosquito Spraying

a. Homeowners would like written notification prior to spraying

15. Ticks

- a. Issue raised whether ticks have ever been a known problem
- b. No known issues from HOA
